The First Sunday of Advent

Happy New Year! This Sunday is the first week of Advent which is the beginning of the liturgical year. We have all learned that Advent is about waiting for the arrival of Jesus, but did you know that it is also about three periods of time? First, it's about the long centuries of preparation before Christ (BC). Second, it's the years of the Lord since his coming (AD). And third, it's about the great future when Christ will come again. What all of this means is that Jesus Christ is the centre of time, the beginning and the end. In him, the past is forgiven, the present moment is sanctified and our future glory is revealed.

So many people are unhappy today because they fail to find meaning in their lives. We do not see beyond what is in front of us, not caring what lies ahead. The true meaning of life is diluted by the culture of instant gratification. As a result, our lives are a series of disassociated moments. We live for the here and now which will pass. We do not care about what is to come, that which last for eternity. The season of Advent brings us back to the great circle of time in which everything is associated with everything else. Everything we do has a consequence. What we do now will affect how receptive we will be for Jesus' Advent. Will we be there welcoming him, or will we be so distracted that we will miss his arrival completely?

This Sunday's Gospel tells us to keep awake. We need to be vigilant against sleepiness which weakens our guard against the Evil One. If we don't keep awake, we are allowing ourselves to be prone to thoughts and tendencies which would lead us away from God, to distract us from his coming. We stay awake by praying constantly. To pray fervently is to stay alert.

CHRISTMAS MASSES

Dear Parishioners,

As you might expect, there will be Christmas Masses in the Parish, but I am afraid they will only be at St Joseph's and will be on Christmas 'eve at 5pm and 7pm and on Christmas Day at 9am and 11am. These four Masses will be streamed but will also be open to Parishioners to attend in person. There will also be a midnight Mass but that will be streamed ONLY. We are very sorry that it will not be possible to have Masses celebrated at Holy Cross or Most Holy Redeemer this year.

Like many Catholic Churches in the Country we are announcing a Ballot for places at the 4 Masses that will be open to our Parishioners. Some Parishes have held their ballots already. Under the current Regulations for Tier 2 we are only allowed to allow a very limited number of people into the Church for Mass.

Our ballot will open on Friday 27th November. You may enter the ballot for yourself **online** (https://rcstortford.org.uk/ballot/) as a single person, for a couple who, according to the Tier 2 Regulations are their own household, or for up to 6 members of your family who, according to the Tier 2 Regulations, are your own household. You must say which Mass you are applying to be put in the ballot for, but you may not apply for more than one Mass, in all, over Christmas 'Eve and Christmas Day together. Multiple applications will be discarded.

<u>If you do not have the internet</u> you are very welcome to telephone the Parish Office, **(01279 654063 9am to 3pm Mon to Fri only)** and we will take your details and enter them into the ballot. The ballot will close on Wednesday 9th December and will be drawn on Thursday 10th December

You will be told by telephone or email on Friday 11th December if you have been successful and a special ticket will be sent to you. If you are successful in the ballot, that ticket must be brought with you to the Mass and you will not be allowed to enter without it.

We are living in extraordinary times, who would ever have thought that we would not be able to welcome over 2,000 people over Christmas 'eve and Christmas Day as we did last year, but we must abide by the Regulations that will be in force.

Thank you for your understanding at this most difficult of times, and may God bless you and all that are dear to you in the Christmas season.

Good afternoon

Please find attached the Sunday message from Fr Antonio on this the first week of Advent and the beginning of the liturgical year. This message can also be found on the news section of our 'New' website which we launch today!

Thank you very much to Fr Antonio (Our wonderful' I-Priest Extraordinaire') who has done a fantastic job. The 'old' website is still working and contains information, but will not be kept primed with up-to-date news or events. There will be a link on the 'old website' which will direct you to the new one, just in case you are unable to find it.

We already have a Twitter account @rcstortford but now also have a facebook account, so please visit those too.

There is also a **very important** notice from Fr Peter attached relating to the provision of the Christmas Masses this year. Please take some time to read it as this year there will be a 'ballot' sytem as because of the restrictions, we are only permitted to allow entry to a limited number of people to St Joseph's. The Christmas ballot opens today 27th November, online https://rcstortford.org.uk/ballot/ and via the telephone (Mon-Fri 9am-3pm) and will close on Wednesday 9th December at midday. The ballot will be drawn on Thursday 10th December and those who have been successful will be told by telephone or email on Friday 11th December. A special ticket will be sent, which will have to be produced to allow entry. All of our Masses will continue to be live streamed. Regrettably there will be no Christmas Mass at Holy Cross or Most Holy Redeemer this year

This week I attended the 'Sycamore Advent course' kindly hosted by the Dad's group, via Zoom. It was really well supported by the parish and huge thanks to David and John who facilitated the session. I really enjoyed it, so thank you! It can often be a little bit out of our comfort zone to join in with some things, but,I have always found that it is worth plucking up the courage and taking a chance, so if you missed out, you can join again this week for the next session or catch up with one of the videos, the link of which can be found further down this newsletter. It was great to meet new people in our 'break out' rooms and discuss 'Happiness'. Listening to what makes people happy was actually really nice, reminiscing about all sorts of things from sweets in our childhood to the 'freedom' of losing a mobile phone, belonging to a community, the love of our family and our faith. Being happy has not been easy for everyone this year, with the loss of loved ones, restrictions on who we see, where we go, how we worship, not having enough food, money or a job. Mental health has also been affected. But, despite this, there have also been moments of happiness with acts of kindness, togetherness and a renewed sense of faith, family and friendship. Neighbours have waved, clapped and spoken with each other perhaps even for the first time and communities have come together to support each other as one.

Music has always been a huge part of making people happy and cheering the mood. It has been wonderful to have our Choir and Music group back in St Joseph's, albeit socially distanced and we have received some lovely messages from those watching the livestreaming about how nice the music sounded and good it made people feel. The other day I revisited the wonderful youtube clip of the Most Holy Redeemer virtual choir singing earlier in the year, not forgetting their fabulous rendition of ' Carlos, Carlos!'Listening to music releases

mood enhancing chemicals (I believe that chocolate does work too!!) There are many happy and 'feel good' songs and music which get us all going, whether it be tapping our feet or humming along. As a teenager I used to love listening to the 'Top 40' on the radio on a Sunday evening recalling the feeling of anticipation, waiting to see which Pop group would be number one and talking to my friends at school about it the following day. Probably like many of my age group, I used to have a radio cassette tape player, on which I would try to record the music, without the presenter speaking(!) pressing down two buttons at a time and trying to time it just right. I actually received an electric shock one day upon trying to record, 'Kid Creole and the Coconuts' which probably served me right, having spent a good ten minutes with my fingers fiddling to rescue a trapped, spooling casette from the inners of the machine and then using a pencil trying to rewind it...

UPDATE RE THE NEW LOCKDOWN RESTRICTIONS

Unfortunately, due to the further COVID-19 restrictions and lockdown, we are **no longer able to gather for public worship from Thursday 5th November until 2nd December 2020** however... not long to wait now!!

In the meantime, Fr Peter and Fr Antonio Mass will continue to celebrate a daily and weekend Parish Mass at St Joseph's behind 'closed doors' albeit without a physical congregation being present. Mass will be live streamed on http://www.churchservices.tv/bishopsstortford so please do join us 'virtually'. Regrettably Mass will not be celebrated at Holy Cross or Most Holy Redeemer.

MASS TIMES AT ST JOSEPH'S VIA THE LIVESTREAMING

Monday- Friday Mass will be broadcast live at 9.30am

Saturday Vigil Mass will be broadcast live at 6pm

Sunday Mass will be broadcast live at 9am and at 11am with music and Cantor.

All of the Masses will be recorded and can be viewed at any time after the time of broadcast.

We have opened St Joseph and the English Martyrs Catholic Church and Holy Cross for private prayer, until we are able to open our Churches again for Mass.

A Steward/s will be in attendance to ensure that our Churches continue to remain COVID secure. Please observe the social distancing measures in place, using hand sanitiser and wearing a face covering (unless exempt) when visiting the Church. We ask you to respect also the capacity limits of 38 individual persons from separate households at any one time at St Josephs and 32 persons at Holy Cross. **Our track and trace measures will continue, but there is no requirement to book a place for private prayer at this time.** We have a QR Code on display already for those with a phone app or we will politely ask for your name and contact details upon arrival, so that individuals can be notified in the event of any suspected Covid-19 case.

Your details will be securely kept for 21 days to enable us to provide details to the trace & test system should an outbreak occur.
