Sunday Message on the Second Sunday of Advent from Fr Peter

The opening prayer (Collect) of this Sunday's Mass sets the scene: "...may no earthly undertaking hinder those who set out in haste to meet your Son, but may our learning of heavenly wisdom, gain us admittance to his company".

It set me to thinking what heavenly wisdom do I need most. ...and that is quite a tough question. I suppose patience is an important one for me and also the need not to see myself as the centre of my world, a danger we can all fall into very easily; "my needs", "my rights" which is another way of saying, "my pride". Most of us do not like change at all, but it is a part of our lives if we are to grow and mature as St John Henry Newman reminds us.

One of the themes of the pontificate of Pope Emeritus, Benedict, was that of 'relativism' – simply put, it is the danger of placing oneself, and only oneself, at the centre of things. Everything is judged as it relates to me and my needs and feelings. That is the opposite of the message that we see lying in the Christmas Crib - a defenceless and dependent baby. We are a part of the world in which we live, we are called upon to relate to and consider all those around us. As we pray so often, "thy will, not mine be done".

So it can be an openness to others and their needs that will help us on our journey towards heavenly wisdom, so, pray for each other on that journey this week.

Good afternoon

Please find attached the Sunday message from Fr Peter on this the second Sunday of Advent which can also be found on our new website www.rcstortford.org.uk

Thank you very much indeed for your encouraging feedback on the website which has been really welcome. Fr Antonio has worked very hard indeed and every comment received has been carefully considered and where further improvements and tweaks can be made this has already been done. We do have a post on the website showing exactly what feedback issues have been resolved to date, but please do let us know if there is something else which you would like to see if this would be helpful.

Well, this week, as Michael Bubble sang, 'It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas'.. with only 20 sleeps to go, the shops now back open and selling their wares, Christmas music playing over sound systems and houses competitively adorned with flashing lights and a variety of dubious inflatable creations bringing many a smile. Some decorations have already been put up early to bring much needed festive cheer in a year which has been very stressful and distressing for so many to say the least. With the country still in a tiered system, politicians debating over the calorific value of a scotch egg, restrictions on our private lives and uncertainty ahead, it is understandable that some people are feeling a little fatigued as we continue to make the necessary sacrifices to ensure that we keep everyone safe.

With many new rules and restrictions governing our health and safety, one area of current concern is our Christmas Crib. Although there are a few weeks to go before Christmas, we need to start planning now with a thorough risk assessment to ensure our crib is COVID-secure.

Here is some helpful guidance courtesy of the Diocese of Portsmouth:

- 1. A maximum of 4 Shepherds only are permitted in the Crib.
- 2. Shepherds must wear facemasks (unless exempt) and strictly observe social distancing (2m or 1m+ with mitigations).
- 3. Jesus, Mary and Joseph form a family bubble and thus may be placed together.
- 4. The Ox and the Ass need Declaration of Non-Contamination Certificates, obtainable from the Department of Agriculture.
- 5. The Three Wise Men, since they come from a non-Schengen Area, will be subject to a 14-day quarantine, whether or not they have tested negative for Covid.
- 6. The straw, moss, palm branches and other decorations must be disinfected, with hands washed for 20 seconds after handling.
- 7. Angels flying over the crib are now forbidden, owing to the aerosol effect produced by the batting of wings.
- 8. Shepherds are permitted provided they are not more than 70 years old or suffering from underlying medical conditions or in another vulnerable category.

9. The Inn, along with other businesses in the hospitality sector, is closed until further notice.

10. For 2020 only, a Pontius Pilate should be added to the Crib to explain to authorised participants the protocols for washing and sanitisation of hands.....

When I first read this message.. it very nearly got me too!!

CHRISTMAS MASS BALLOT - As advised last week our Christmas Mass ballot opened on Friday 27th November. You may enter the ballot for yourself online https://rcstortford.org.uk/ballot as a single person, for a couple who, according to the Tier 2 Regulations are their own household, or for up to 6 members of your family who, according to the Tier 2 Regulations, are your own household. You must say which Mass you are applying to be put in the ballot for, but you may not apply for more than one Mass, in all, over Christmas 'Eve and Christmas Day together. Multiple applications will be discarded.

If you do not have the internet you are very welcome to telephone the Parish Office, (01279 654063 9am to 3pm Mon to Fri only) and we will take your details and enter them into the ballot. The ballot will close on Wednesday 9th December and will be drawn on Thursday 10th December. You will be told by telephone or email on Friday 11th December if you have been successful and a special ticket will be sent to you.
