Sunday Message from Fr Peter on the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time.docx;

Good afternoon

Please find attached the Sunday Message from Fr Peter which can also be found on our website.

Whilst wearing a face mask for most of the day, one of the main thing that I notice when greeting fellow mask wearers, are the tops of their heads and their 'smiling' eyes. Apparantly William Shakespeare once said, 'Your eyes are the windows to your soul' and in the Holy Gospel, St Matthew teaches us that,' The lamp of the body is the eye. It follows that if your eye is sound, your whole body will be filled with light'..

At the weekend, with the above passage floating around my head (hoping that my grubby windows were not a direct correlation of my sometimes mischevious soul) I was shamed into cleaning my external glassware. A brief ray of sunlight had hit the double-glazed patio doors of my small, south facing garden, beautifully illuminating the feathered, yet artistic, dusty outline of 'Big Pigeon' and 'Chum', resident daily diners at my bird table. Whilst hosting the only real visitors to my home for nearly a year, both of them, by chance, had bashed into the window some months earlier, leaving perfect imprints.
