The Sunday Message from Fr Antonio

We read all sorts of health warnings or advice on diets and the importance of exercise ... but all too often we just move on to the next news article and ignore what we've just read. We are not willing to change our eating habits. We are not willing to make the effort to go to the gym.

Knowledge without willpower is useless. Schools and the government dedicate much time and money in sex education but this knowledge has not stopped the alarming increase in sexually transmitted diseases and unwanted pregnancies. Another example is the tragic problem of world hunger. With modern science, medical advancements and rapid communication, we have the knowledge to solve the problem, but do we have the willpower?

We need a change of heart, we need to repent. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus tells us to repent and believe the Good News. To repent means to change in two ways: to change our way of thinking and then our way of living. Jesus began his preaching with the message to repent and believe. Notice that he said repent before believe. This is because it may be necessary to make changes within ourselves before we can make an act of faith.

Believing is more than mentally accepting what is said in the Bible or what the Church teaches. There are people who fully believe while they are bitter and cruel. Believing must come with a willingness to change attitudes and behaviour. Believing means giving our hearts to God not only in the way we think but also in the way we act.

Good afternoon

Please find attached the Sunday message from Fr Antonio which can also be found on the news section of our website.

Well, it's been another busy week! We have seen the inauguration ceremony of the new President of the United States, accompanied by the 'Wet wipe Guy' in his duffle coat and tartan scarf, who dutifully sanitised the lectern (albeit not up the high standard that we have in the Church!), many of our Parishioners have thankfully started to have their first vaccine jab and there are Easter Eggs and Hot Cross buns already in the shops!

Fr Peter and I had a conversation the other afternoon about such treats, which somehow developed into a culinary discussion on what tastes nicest on the top of a toasted crumpet. I think that I am more of a traditional butter and a thin scraping of jam kind of gal, whereas Father had experimented with scrambled egg delicately topped off with anchovies. Having been tempted by Fr Peter's top crumpet tips, I must confess to now having bought some, along with my first early pack of hot cross buns too, which I have been enjoying each day for breakfast.

It is said that different parts of the hot cross bun have a certain meaning. The cross represents the crucifixion of Jesus, and the spices inside signify the spices used to embalm Him. Some believe that the hot cross bun originated from St Albans, where Brother Thomas Rocliffe, a 14th Century monk at St Albans Abbey, developed a similar recipe called an 'Alban Bun' and distributed the bun to the local poor on Good Friday, starting in 1361.

In 1592, during the reign of Elizabeth I, it was forbidden to sell hot cross buns and other spiced breads, except at burials, on Good Friday, or at Christmas. If you broke the decree then you had to give all of your buns to the poor. As a result, hot cross buns were primarily made in home kitchens. Further attempts to suppress the sale of them took place during the reign of James I of England/James VI of Scotland (1603-1625).

The first definite record of hot cross buns apparently comes from a London street cry and appeared in Poor Robin's Almanac in 1733: "Good Friday comes this month, the old woman runs. With one or two a penny, hot cross buns"...
