Sunday message from Fr Antonio on the Second Sunday of Lent

There are sides of us that only our best friends have seen, or things about us that only they know. Best friends are privileged because they get to see the real and the whole of us, not just the image that we like to project to the rest of society. This is what happened at the Transfiguration in the Gospel this Sunday: Jesus revealed Himself to three of His closest friends – Peter, James and John – in a way He had not done before. He revealed Himself as they would know Him in heaven. For that brief period of time, the privileged three disciples saw His heavenly glory on earth. It was both to strengthen them for what was to come (suffering and death) and to give them a glimpse of the heavenly life to which they were called. It was a moment of special grace and revelation.

We don't have to be Peter, James or John to witness Christ's Transfiguration. All of us are given opportunities in our day-to-day lives to see Jesus' power and glory by looking at the world around us. Jesus wants us to be His best friends, to see Him as He really is. Just as His face shone like the sun and His clothes dazzled with whiteness during the Transfiguration, He wants to be for us a bright, shining light to follow and to give us hope, especially when darkness seems to envelop us. He is a light that never dims, a light that never disappears. It is just sometimes, we allow ourselves to lose sight of that light. But like a true best friend, Christ is just waiting for us to call to bring light back into our lives.

The weather this last week has been absolutely glorious with stunning evening skies and the ground dry enough to catch up with a few overdue jobs in the garden. Spring is well and truly here with new shoots and bulbs starting to burst through. My resident birds, 'Big pigeon' and 'Chum' have had to share their daily offerings with a host of new friends who have started to re-visit the garden, including what I think was a Red kite, gliding over the top of the house with its vast wingspan. Interestingly, a black-browed babbler bird of Indonesia which is one of Asia's least known species and thought to be extinct, has recently been sighted in a Bornean jungle 180 years after it was last seen. It is believed to be one of the world's most elusive songbirds and was stumbled upon by two local men. What an amazing find! Perhaps there is a Bishop's Stortford equivalent?

My favourite tree is the Cherry blossom which I have loved since I was a child and I look forward to them blooming each year, so, I was very happy to read that the National Trust will be planting a series of 'Blossom circles' around the UK as a symbol of reflection and hope. The first site at the Queen Elizabeth Olympic park in the same borough as the temporary Nightingale hospital, will commemorate all those who have tragically lost their lives in the pandemic as a living memorial. There are another three blossom spaces planned for Newcastle, Nottingham and Plymouth. From cherry, plum, hawthorn and crab apple trees, I'm sure that the delicate blooms will bring a much-needed boost of cheerful colour and a lasting reminder of thanksgiving, peace and enjoyment in each city...
