Sunday Message from Fr Peter on the Fifth Sunday of Lent



I am writing this on Thursday 18th March. It is my 70th birthday. "Oh no"! I hear you saying, "You've had that already." Well, yes and no... You see you are right. I have had the 70th anniversary of my physical birth, but today is the 70th anniversary of my spiritual birth since today is the 70th celebration of my Baptism. I know who my Godparents were but I don't remember ever meeting them at an age that I would have remembered them. I still have the silver napkin ring with my initials on it that one of my late aunts gave me. Alas the silver rosary beads given me by my Godparents were stolen from our baggage on the way to Australia in 1955. But I do know that I was baptised by Canon Cristall in St Joseph's Church at Epsom. When I was young I thought I must have been very important to have been baptized by a Canon!

Now, the question I find myself asking myself this year as you may well have done too, is, if I have been a Christian now for 70 years, what have I done about it? It's a bald and quite tough question. I suppose I can let myself off for the first few years but as I grew older I knew what I was doing and was responsible for my actions, so, once again, what have I done about being a Christian? Some might say, "...well, you are a priest so look at how much you have by being a priest". That is very kind, but it doesn't really let me off the hook. You see the truth lies in how much and how strongly have I tried or have I just let it all happen, and has my heart and soul been in it?

The answer for me, this year I think, lies in the lenten Mass readings. Again and again the writers of the Old Testament Scriptures that we have listened to remind us of all the mess ups that the people of Israel made – and there were some very big ones. Yet, despite all this God kept faith with them and drew them back, reminding them all the time of his love and forgiveness. That has to be the key to it all. There is a real danger that we can, and sometimes do, drift along without really focusing. But then comes an event like today is for me and suddenly everything comes into focus and, recognizing how blessed and loved we are, we can make a firm promise of amendment and hear the good Lord saying something like, "Well done Peter, my boy, now, on we go, together!"

Sunday Message from Fr Peter on the Fifth Sunday of Lent.docx;

Good afternoon

Please find attached the Sunday Message from Fr Peter along with the most adorable photograph which can also be found on the news section of our website.

This week I experienced a few issues on the communication front, receiving a fraudulent phishing text from the Royal mail which seems to be doing the rounds, my sent emails went astray ending up in junk bins and then I received post through my letter box only to find out that it was for someone else in a completely different road. One of the envelopes looked like a birthday card, so, adorned with my mask and gloves, I dutifully walked and delivered it to the rightful owner which I was very happy to do.

On the way back home, 'Big pigeon' and 'Chum' the resident birds in my garden were wandering around waiting to be fed. It got me thinking about 'Carrier pigeons' for some strange reason and how on earth you would go about training them to deliver important messages. Not that I see myself as any type of 'Pigeon fancier' or wishing to saddle up my feathered friends, to save on the price of a stamp, far from it,(although tempting!) but where would you start?

The Royal Pigeon Racing Association (yes i did Google it!) gives an interesting history and guidance on how to do it. Racing pigeons are descended from the Rock Dove, and the earliest recorded reference to the use of messenger pigeons comes from Ramses III (c1200 BC) when they were used to convey news between cities regarding the flood state of the Nile.

The Romans used pigeons to convey messages throughout the empire, for example Olympic games results for betting syndicates, and ships warning their home port of their imminent arrival.

Carrier pigeons were held in very high esteem in the Middle East and were called "The Kings Angels", and in medieval times pigeons were brought back to Europe by the Crusaders.

In the 1800's there was an official pigeon postal service throughout France, and this was expanded between capitals so that a postal service by carrier pigeon between London and Paris was advertised in 1870.

Pigeons were used extensively as message carriers by armies on both sides during World War 1 and World War 2. Over a quarter of a million pigeons were used in the last war alone. British pigeon fanciers donated thousands of their best birds to help in the war effort and all three of the Armed Services plus the Civil Defence, used them.

The Germans, who also used pigeons as message carriers, were so concerned about intelligence getting back to the Allied Forces on mainland Europe and England that they employed hawk handlers to release birds of prey to attack the pigeons. The British Government ordered a cull of these birds along the south coast of England where they were most prevalent in order that the message carriers had every opportunity to get home. Probably the most telling and significant acknowledgement of the pigeons' contribution to the war effort was when Maria Dickin, founder of the People's Dispensary for Sick Animals (PDSA) instituted the Dickin Medal, widely called the 'Animal Victoria Cross' with 32 medals awarded to to homing pigeons.

The British Royal family began to keep pigeons in the late nineteenth century, and pigeon racing became a sport of the masses in the early 1900's. Interestingly there has been a Royal loft at Sandringham since and Her Majesty the Queen is still patron of the Royal Pigeon Association today....

HONG KONG BNO VISA ROUTE- At the end of January, the government opened a new visa route for people from Hong Kong with British National Overseas Status to resettle in the UK with their close family members. It is expected that at least 130,000 people could enter the UK during the first year. There will be a need to welcome people and help them integrate into their new communities. SETTLEMENT SCHEME FOR EUROPEAN CITIZENS- EU, EEA and Swiss citizens who were living in the UK by 31st December 2020 have until 30th June

2021 to apply for the Settlement Scheme. Those who do not apply are at risk of losing their rights to live and work here or access important services such as healthcare. There is a need to continue drawing this to people's attention as we approach the deadline. Older and vulnerable people may require assistance with the online application or not even know that their status is at risk. In many cases their main point of contact with society will be through the Church.


