The Sunday Message from Fr Antonio on the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

During the Great Depression of the 1930s, millions of Americans were out of work and many thousands were hungry. Religious groups set up breadlines to feed the hungry. One of these was the Franciscan monastery in Cincinnati, Ohio. Every evening, the Friars, Brothers and lay volunteers prepared and gave a nourishing sandwich of bread and meat to hundreds of hungry men and women. It was interesting to note the reactions of the recipients. Many accepted the sandwich with a smile and a thank you. Others, with heads hanging, snatched the food package and shuffled off. Some tore the wrapper at once and started eating as they hurried away. Most of them ate every last crumb after a silent prayer and put the wrapping into a nearby container, though some would eat only the meat and discard the bread on the roadside. A few discontented ones just opened the package and then threw the entire contents away in protest.

The way those hungry people reacted to sandwich is a lot like the way Jesus' listeners received His words in this Sunday's Gospel. Along with the other readings, the Gospel challenges us to trust in the providence of a loving and caring God, and to hunger and thirst for the Bread of eternal life — the Holy Eucharist. As human beings, we hunger for many things besides food and material possessions. We hunger to be recognised and honoured, to love and be loved, to be listened to and to be appreciated, to help, to console, to encourage people, and to receive gratitude. But only God can satisfy our various forms of spiritual hunger.

Jesus not only gives the Bread of Life (John 6:11, 27) — Jesus *is* the Bread of Life (John 6:35, 48). The *Giver* and the *Gift* are One and the same. As the Bread of Life from Heaven, only He can satisfy man's spiritual hunger. While bodily food helps us to stay alive in this world, spiritual food sustains and develops our supernatural life which will last forever in Heaven. Through God's infinite love we are given, in the Blessed Eucharist, the very Author of the Gifts of Faith and Sanctifying Grace. Thus, the Eucharist is not a mere "symbol" of Jesus; rather, it is Jesus' Real Bodily Presence in His glorified, scarred, risen Body. This Bread of Life — Who is Jesus Himself — gives mankind a new relationship with God, a relationship of trust, obedience and love.

Good afternoon

Please find attached the Sunday Message from Fr Antonio on the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time and below is an update from Fr Peter, both of which can be found on our parish website.

Fr Peter writes:

It has been good to see more of you coming together celebrating our weekday Masses in the light of the latest Government Regulations and on last Sunday morning there were just over 70 at the 9am morning Mass. (Still a far cry from the pre-Covid, 200 or so...) Great to be able to greet people who felt they wanted to return and who knew they were safe with all the precautions that are still being taken. Some were full of news about holidays that they had managed to take, mostly in the UK, and how good they found it to be able to have done that with their families. Lovely, too, to see old friends greeting each other with smiles on their faces. There is still a long way to go of course. Certain precautions will take longer to be removed than others, and we still have a serious responsibility to those in our Community who are still shielding and who remain very cautious.

We are eagerly looking forward to all three of our churches being open for Sunday Masses from the first weekend in September, and that will be a great cause for celebration. We will be asking parishioners at Most Holy Redeemer in Sawbridgeworth to give a hand in later August to clean and put to rights that lovely little church ready to welcome us all. We will also have to run Legionella tests on all the water there as well as the hot water cylinders in the Windhill Churches Centre, since no water has been drawn off for nearly a year – this was something that had not occurred to us till we had a recent health and safety inspection which turned out be very helpful.

Speaking of holidays, the time has come for Fr Antonio and myself to try and get a break. It has been a very long time since either of us has managed that. So, we are each taking just two weeks during August: Fr Antonio the first two weeks and myself, the second two weeks. That will include weekends so that we can have a proper bit of rest time completely away. Until a few years ago we usually managed to get "supply" priests in the summer but, of course, no one can come from abroad at the moment. As for "supply" priests in the Diocese, nearly all of those are over 75 and shielding still and are not available. You may remember that in 2018 we had Fr Angel from Spain the last of a long list of wonderful priests from overseas to look after us, but in 2019 it proved impossible and since then we have had to have August Masses only at St Joseph's, not celebrating Sunday Masses at Sawbridgeworth or Much Hadham. It will be the same this year to enable your priests to have at least a short rest. Priests in parishes are expected to take 4 weeks break in the summer and one week each after Christmas and Easter but we will probably be forgoing most of that for this year, for the moment taking just two weeks each. We hope to make some of it up perhaps later in the year but will wait and see.

We continue here at No 3 Windhill to do everything we can to protect everyone in the parish and now to plan the final re-opening of our three churches. Fr Antonio and I are very grateful to all those parishioners who have helped us both to carry the burden of these very difficult times; there have been times of exhaustion and deep frustration but, please God, we are all finding a way through to a safer future.

PLANNED WORKS ON WINDHILL - We have today received the following letter re connecting electricity to the new hotel being built near to the train station. We do not believe that the disabled parking bays will be affected but there will be disruption to the footpath and road. We have advised the company of the details of our Mass times and all other Church events.

Lydon Contracting, on behalf of UK Power Solutions, will be excavating along the footpath on Windhill (from The Granary to St Michaels Church) between 04/08/21 – 29/08/21 to allow for new HV electricity ducts to be installed. During this time, we kindly ask that you refrain from parking within the works area outside of these properties. As soon as the barriers are removed from the parking bays you may park your vehicle again. Our prime objective is to ensure the works are carried out in a safe and efficient manner with every effort being made to keep disruption to a minimum. On completion, all trenches will be backfilled and reinstated to the required highways specification. Your co-operation and patience during these essential works are appreciated.

We plan to kick-start our Confirmation programme again this autumn. What form it will take (i.e. in person or virtual) has yet to be established, as we are awaiting up-to-date government announcements and also need to make the necessary decisions regarding use of our parish facilities. However, we would like to gauge interest, as this will enable us to plan accordingly.
