The Sunday Message from Fr Antonio on the Twenty First Sunday in Ordinary Time

There are times when the situation is simply black or white. You are either in or out. You either stay or leave. There is no room for indecision. The time to choose is now. This is the situation in this Sunday's Gospel. People either accepted or rejected Jesus. Most did the latter. Only a few chose to stay with him.

This Sunday's Gospel is about coming to a decision and sticking by it. Jesus had the rare ability to offer a straight option—you were either for him, or against him. He himself was fully committed to his mission, and to all that was best for us, even if at times his disciples complained. He was used to being criticised by his enemies, but when he could not depend on the loyalty of his friends, he had to call them to account.

In a way it was hard on the disciples, because, by the nature of what Jesus offered, it could not just be some sort of an a la carte menu, from which they could choose whatever suited them. When some of his followers began to walk away, he didn't run after them and try to reason with them. That was not his way. Rather he turned to those who stayed and challenged them to commit themselves.

There are three types of people in every gathering: those who cause things to happen; those who watch things happening; and those who don't know what is happening! Peter was the one who stepped up to the occasion. "Lord," he said, "who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God." For Jesus, losing the others was worth it, if it left him with loyal followers like Peter.

Jesus was not concerned with numbers. His whole life shows that the value of something does not bear any necessary relation to the number of people who support it. Popularity does not necessarily show where truth is to be found. Numbers are not everything. We follow Jesus not because he was or is popular but because, in the word of Peter in the Gospel, we recognise that he has the message of eternal life. He is the Truth.

COLD CALLING SCAM - Hertfordshire County Council Trading Standards is warning of fraudulent cold calls being made to residents who have had spray foam loft insulation applied in the past. The fraudsters may tell you that there are issues with the original installing company, and they may frighten you by talking about fire risks associated with that insulation. They will tell you that you will be able to claim back the cost of the installation and that they will be able to remedy the works essentially for free.

None of those claims are true. What is true however, is that customer lists have fallen into the hands of scammers who are making these targeted sales calls. Once in a property, they produce a 'report' indicating safety problems and then arrange to carry out 'remedial' works themselves. Although they say the work is free, they will need paying first, telling you to try to claim money back from your bank for the original defective works. In the absence of a genuine inspection report, this will not happen. If payment was made by cheque or bank transfer, there is no obligation for the bank to pay anything back in these circumstances anyway. It is a scam.

If you, or anyone you know, has had this work done in the past please be prepared for these calls and tell them that you are not interested. Please do not allow the trader to enter your home.

If you have had this work done and need advice, please contact Hertfordshire County Council Trading Standards via Citizens Advice on 0808 223 1133. They have a small stock of call blocking devices that they can lend to victims of landline telephone frauds, please contact them to discuss if appropriate.
