APPEAL FROM THE FOOD BANK - We anticipate that demand, which is already high, will increase as we approach the Autumn and Winter due to a combination of factors including the end of the furlough scheme and the Universal Credit uplift, the higher cost of food and the increase rise in gas and electricity prices. Unfortunately, this is coming at a time when for a variety of reasons our stocks of food are already low (the Storehouse we share with Harlow Foodbank has never been as depleted). So, the more food items that churches can donate the better! We are also hoping to recruit more volunteers to cope with the likely increased demand - particularly people who could volunteer regularly. Items most in demand include soup, pasta, rice, noodles, cereals, tinned foods, toiletries, jam, biscuits etc.

ST LAWRENCE'S SCHOOL ZAMBIA - A few months ago, we received news that Sr. Angela, Headteacher of St. Lawrence's Community School in Zambia was being moved to another part of the country. This means that the personal contact with the school we are supporting is no longer there. It seemed an appropriate time, therefore, to close this charity. Most Holy Redeemer has supported the St. Lawrence's School community for the past 20 years as part of the Millennium Project chosen by our congregation, which also included the provision of new stained-glass windows for our little church.

Over this period, our parishioners have seen the building of a generator, new toilets, a shower block, the provision of a well and a water tank, plus funding for books and classrooms for St. Lawrence's School.

Most Holy Redeemer is very grateful for all of the very generous support you have given over the past twenty years.

Our Knitting Group at MHR, however, will keep knitting to support Zambia and other poor regions around the world which are assisted through the charitable works of The Sisters of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, also known as the "Chigwell Nuns".

Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen
