Well, it has come upon us at last!! The First Sunday of Advent...... I can't really quite believe it but my calendar says it clearly so it must be true. Where have all the months gone.... I really do not know!

So, where do we begin? I think the key for me is in the Gospel where Jesus says "Stay Awake!", as simple as that. But I hear you say, what sort of staying awake is He talking about? Is it not dozing off, staying alert, listening with a careful ear, recognising signs...all sorts of possibilities!



I think being awake means having all our senses working together so that we get a full picture of what is happening around us. All five senses need to be engaged: to hear the presence of God, for instance in the poor; to feel God touching our hearts as well as our bodies; to see the presence of God, perhaps in His creation around us; to smell the sheep of God's flock as Pope Francis encourages us to do; to taste the flavour of goodness and kindness in all that we do.

OK then, that is a timetable for the four Sundays of Advent and we can keep the last one, 'taste' for Christmas Day itself!

Please find attached the Sunday Message from Fr Peter on the First Sunday of Advent which can also be found on our website.

Advent is a special season in the Church's year when we prepare to celebrate the coming of Christ. However, for many people experiencing food poverty, Christmas can be a difficult time. Food insecurity has increased by 250% during the pandemic, and last year, 8.4 million people in the U.K. regularly did not get enough to eat.

As you may already be aware, the Bishop's Stortford Foodbank for the past couple of years has run a 'Reverse Advent calendar' during which time you collect daily items listed, place into a box and then deliver the food parcel to the Foodbank. Today was the first drop off day and there are three more to go with Monday 6th December being the last drop off for completed boxes. It is not too late to get involved if you would like to help. Regular Food donations are of course positively welcomed and can be dropped off at the crates in the local supermarkets and monetary donations are gratefully received too, either online or by sending a cheque directly to the foodbank. HONOURING SUNDAY -During the pandemic, public worship was suspended for a time and there have been restrictions on parish life. As a result, people have been exploring other ways to practice their faith including Spiritual Communion via live streaming. An extract from the Bishop's Conference. 'The Sunday Eucharist is a gift; as God's holy people we are called to praise and thank God in the most sublime way possible. When the Church speaks of the Sunday obligation, it reminds us that attending Mass is a personal response to the selfless offering of Christ's love.

At this time, we recognise that for some people there may be certain factors which hinder attendance at Sunday Mass. The pandemic is clearly not over. The risk of infection is still present. For some, there is legitimate fear in gathering together. As your bishops, we recognise that these prevailing circumstances suggest that not everyone is yet in the position to fulfil the absolute duty to attend freely Sunday Mass.'

#### SYNOD 2023: The time has come to participate!

## What is it?

The synod is in response to Pope Francis' call for us to become a "synodal Church"; in other words, a Church which journeys together. A synod is a council of the Church normally convened for us to think and pray together on an issue of doctrine, administration or application. According to the synod handbook, this

particular synod is "an opportunity for the entire people of God to discern together how to move forward on the path towards being a more synodal church in the long-term". In the first stage, we are called to reflect together as a parish on how to renew our sense of mission in the light of eighteen months' experience of pandemic.

Your feedback, both from the Listening Meetings and the questionnaire, will be submitted to the diocese. They, in turn, will collect feedback from all parishes which will be put together in a document and sent to Rome for the synod taking place in October 2023.

HRH QUEEN ELIZABETH'S PLATINUM JUBILEE in 2022 Time Capsule and Tree planting - To honour HRH the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 the Town Council will be burying a time capsule and planting a tree in Monastery Park. The Town Council is calling for residents of Bishop's Stortford to supply a record of their memories of the Queen's 70-year reign to be included in the capsule. The entries can be written text or stories, drawings, photographs, newspaper clippings or small physical items etc. The Council will also include items representing Bishop's Stortford in 2022 such as a map, newspaper etc.

All entries can be dropped off to the Tourist Information Centre either in person, via post or electronically via tic@bishopsstortford.org until 4pm on 31 January 2022. Physical entries must be submitted with a donation form available from Town Council's website or at the Tourist Information Centre. For preservation all entries must be in polyethylene bags (a sandwich bag).

Please not do include any entries with batteries, staples, paper clips, rubber bands, cling type films such as protective wrappers or any food products as this destroys preservation. The time capsule will be buried and the tree will be planted on 5 February 2022 in Monastery Park, where there will be a ceremony with the Mayor. This date has been chosen because HRH the Queen succeeded to the Throne on the 6 February 1952, on the death of her father, King George VI. She was in Kenya and became the first Sovereign in 200 years to accede while abroad. Members of the public are also invited to attend the ceremony and further details will be released soon.
