The Sunday Message from Fr Antonio on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

There are 1.34 billion Catholics in the whole world – that's about 17.7 per cent of the global population. That's a massive number and it would be easy for us to think that as individuals, we are insignificant to the Church, that the Church could very well survive without us. When we read St. Paul's words in the Second Reading this Sunday about being one body with many parts, you might feel that you're a foot rather than a hand, as St. Paul would say (1 Corinthians 12:15). It feels that so many people are so much more vital to the functioning of the body of Christ than yourself. There's the mother of six kids, on the parish council, who has a son in seminary. Or the successful businessman who generously gave thousands of pounds to fix the church's heating. Or the catechist who prepares 80 kids for First Holy Communion and never misses daily Mass. Are you really as important as these members?

The answer is yes! "God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended" (1 Corinthians 12:18). This means unequivocally that each member is essential to the proper functioning of the whole body. That includes you. He intended you to be an important part of his body. He intended you to be where you are, as you are.

Jesus called you and made you part of his body through baptism. He knows why he called you—and it's not so that you would be exactly like someone else. He loves you in a way that he loves no one else. That means you are just as dear to his heart as the people who might look like 100 times more valuable than you.

It is important, then, to see the body of Christ—and yourself—the way God does. Each person has a role to play, and if everyone were the same, the Church wouldn't be all that God wants it to be. God made you exactly as you are to help make his body, the Church, whole.

We are very pleased to welcome Fr Peter back to the parish this weekend following a period of convalescence, although, he does still have hospital appointments over the coming week. Last Saturday, I spent a very nice, but chilly day in the capital, walking around the sites and revisiting the Tower of London, somewhere I have been several times over the years. I was surprised to see that they are currently in the process of digging up the moat and learned that this was in preparation for the celebration of the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen where a spectacular, colourful, vibrant field of flowers will fill and transform the space. In the spring, over 20 million seeds will be sown in the moat from carefully designed seed mixes erupting into new colours and patterns to create a dramatic ' Super bloom' display from June to September. Visitors will be able wander along a weaving path into the centre of the flowers and experience a specially commissioned sound installation with sculptural elements aimed to make you feel at home amongst the bees and butterflies!
